SECURITY LEVEL 1:

For general documents, to be made illegible.



SECURITY LEVEL 3:

For confidential documents, to be made illegible.



SECURITY LEVEL 5:

For extremely high security requirements.



SECURITY LEVEL 2:

For internal documents, to be made illegible.




SECURITY LEVEL 4:

For secret documents, to be made illegible.



LEVEL 6:

Not listed under DIN 32 757, for maximum security requirements.



SECURITY LEVELS

Documents can be classified according to the security level appropriate to their level of confidentiality. DIN 32 757 defines five security levels and provides recommendations on how to destroy a document assigned to each of these categories, whereby the higher the security level, the smaller the shred size of the strips or particles. For special types of users an additional "Level 6" has established itself, exceeding the DIN standard.

For high volumes, as in the case of e.g. high-capacity shredders, it is possible to achieve a higher security level by additional measures, such as mixing or compacting the strips or particles.
